Chinese Musical Instruments Technique Grade Exam in Canada

1. Purpose

The Central Conservatory of Music is China's one of the most senior musical institute offering accredited examinations to overseas applicants. The Standard Grade Examination Committee of the CCOM has the mandate of expanding musical education and its stylistic tradition, and it provides authoritative musical achievement level assessment for overseas Chinese instrumental musicians and students.

To expand the culture of Chinese music, the Central Conservatory of Music of China (CCOM) in collaboration with B.C. Chinese Music Association (BCCMA), have hosted since 2006 the Chinese Instrumental Technique Grade Exam and Fundamentals of Chinese Music Theory Written Exam in Canada. CCOM will assign examiners from Beijing based on designated criteria syllabus written by CCOM professors and subsequently will be issued Certificate of Accomplishment by the CCOM. The aim of this collaboration is to raise the professional quality of Chinese music performance and to encourage the local development of multiculturalism in Canada.

2. Grade Examination

Subjects :

Erhu (Chinese bowed fiddle)	Pipa (Chinese plucked pear-shape lute)
Yangqin (Chinese dulcimer)	Zheng (Chinese plucked zither)
Dizi (Chinese bamboo flute)	Zhongruan (Chinese plucked long-necked lute)
Sheng (Chinese mouth organ)	Suona (Chinese horn)

Contestants : All Canadian residents and citizens can participate in the examination.

Examination level : Technical examinations from Grade One (1) to Grade Ten (10).

Grade 1 to 6 : Grade 4, 5, 6 are Mandatory exam to strengthen the basic requirements and Examinee can apply simultaneously for two grades exam. Examinee must pass Grade 4, 5 or 6 before they can apply for Grade 7.

Grade 7, 8, 9 and 10 are not allowed to skip grades exam in line with the requirements of the off-campus curriculum of the Central Conservatory of Music, but Examinee can apply for up to two grades at the same time.

Technique section :

- Grade 1 to 6 : One etude and one music.
- Grade 7 to 10 : One etude and two music.

Oral section:

- Grade 1 to 6 : Brief introduction of the selected music, Quizzes extracurricular questions of Sight-Singing and Rhythm to test reaction and avoid memorizing.
- Grade 7 to 10 : Oral test will be replaced by evaluation of Generality performance, Music expression and Technique.

Examination requirements :

- **Examinees must bring the designated original textbook** for their exam regardless of the examinee's preference to perform with or without their music. Failure to comply may result in rejection from the exam.
- Examinees if less than 18 of age for the Grade 1 to 9 and **in all ages for the Grade 10 must memorize their music pieces.**
- Exam will be executed behind close door with examinee, examiner and secretary / translator. No companion is allowed and will not be opened to the public.
- Examinees are required to **bring their own tuned musical instruments** for the exam.
- Due to time constraints for the exam, the examiner may choose with discretion to end the examinee performance unaffected the result of the evaluation.
- No accompaniment is permitted in all grades.

Examination Rules :

- Examinee must report at the exam site 15 minutes prior to the start of the exam to register with the Exam Permit and photo identification. Late arrivals may have their examination status rejected.
- Examinees that do not arrive on time are considered to have forfeited their exam and are not given the opportunity for a re-test or a refund. If the examinee suffers from a communicable illness and is unable to attend, but is able to provide the proper medical documentation within 10 days of the end of the examination, the exam fee will be refunded.
- Examinees or related persons are expected to attend to their own personal belongings. The safety of young examinees is also the responsibility of the parent, teacher, or guardian who signs the application form for the young examinee.
- With the exception of the representatives of the CCOM, local personnel of the assessment test, translator and related staff, all loitering, eavesdropping, watching, and video/audio recording of any kind are strictly prohibited in front of the entrance to the exam area.
- With the exception of equipment necessary to the exam, examinees are prohibited from carrying other items into the exam area. Violators will have their exam status cancelled and may be expelled from the exam site.
- The exam will be conducted in Chinese Mandarin. If the examinee requires translation services, please specify the request upon registration of the exam.
- Examinees that perform with their music must be responsible for turning their own pages, and not require the assistance of the assessment panel. Examinees must notify the staff at registration if assistance is required and upon authorization, friends and acquaintances (not teachers or parents) are allowed to help the examinees turn their pages.
- Evaluation Form will be sent to the teachers passing to the examinees after 30 working days and the Certificate of Accomplishment will be handled the same way after 90 working days.
- Central Conservatory of Music, China and the BC Chinese Music Association reserved the right to the final assessment.
- Examinees must bring the designated original textbook for their exam regardless of the examinee's preference to perform with or without their music. Failure to comply may result in rejection from the exam.

1. All applications for registration must meet the examination rules set by the Central Conservatory of Music. The Central Conservatory of Music and the BC Chinese Music Association have the final right to decide whether or not to accept any application.

2. Late applications will be considered by the organizer individually, candidates will be required to pay an overdue fee of \$20.00 if approved.
